### Sunday School Is Back Soon!



### New! File Sharing via Dropbox

During July, all members of Centenary UMC should have received an e-mail saying that you were referred to Dropbox by Centenary UMC with a link to download the Dropbox program.

By clicking on that link, following the instructions and downloading Dropbox free of charge to your computer Dropbox gives the church an additional half gig of memory, allowing us to put even more material and information on Dropbox. This will also allow you to set up your own personal Dropbox system by following the tutorials that open when you first go into Dropbox.

All members should have also received three e-mail invitations to gain access to three files on the Centenary Dropbox:

- 1.) Forms for Church & Ministry Use: This folder will contain forms for registering for Sunday School, VBS, submitting a prayer request, requesting a reimbursement for money spent on church ministry and events, as well as other documents.
- 2.) The Chimes Newsletter: This folder will have the current and recently-archived issues of the Chimes Newsletter to reread, verify information, or to cut and paste articles for promotion of and information about things going on at Centenary UMC.
- 3.) Information About Coming Events: This folder will contain flyers and promotional materials about upcoming events at Centenary UMC for you to print out and hang in various places in the community, as well as post on social media to help spread the word and be in-the-know about upcoming events at Centenary UMC.

If you did not receive these e-mail invitations, please contact the church office to let them know.

Other ministry groups such as the Sunday School Staff and the Worship team already are using Dropbox to share information and files with each other. Feel free to contact the church office to see how your ministry could benefit from Dropbox!

### Youth Mission Trip

Four volunteers from Centenary's Youth Group attended an 8-day mission trip to West Memphis, Arkansas in June. The four volunteers, Sam Uehling, Jordan Doyle, Jake Stukenberg, and youth leader Eugene Uehling, gave a report to the congregation on July 7, on the week of their return. The group shared reflections of waking up at 5:30 a.m. to eat breakfast, pack a lunch, and be on their bus to head to their worksites at 6:30 a.m. While in West Memphis during the last week of June, the heat index ranged from 105 to 115.

This is the 11<sup>th</sup> year that CUMC has joined Sidekick Missions on a summer mission trip. The trip this year, from June 22-29, included a stop on the way in Springfield, Illinois. The group, consisting of 150 youth and adults on this year's trip from nearly a dozen churches across southern Wisconsin, stayed overnight in the Springfield UMC gymnasium and adjacent hallways and rooms. The group filled 3 coach buses.

Sidekick Missions worked with Pastor Jeff Williams from the Union Avenue Baptist Church, in Memphis, Tennessee. During the week in Memphis, the group stayed in the various large activity rooms at that church, had fellowship time and meals in their dining hall, and worshipped each night in their sanctuary (with a praise band). Pastor Williams coordinates volunteers groups throughout the summer with the City of West Memphis. For 2013, the city received 600 applications for work from mission volunteers. Of those, 60 homes were selected for funding. During our week there, 12 homes were being worked on, all of which needed roof replacement, and more than half needed painting, as well.

Pastor Josh Pegram, from Immanuel UMC in Ripon, led the evening worship with the theme of "Unleash" (from John 16:31-33). "The work ethic of the youth who go on these trips continues to amaze me," said Pastor Josh when asked about his thoughts on the trip. "I probably shouldn't be surprised by it any more, but I am. They just want to get to their sites, get working, and get the job done. I'm proud of the way they care about helping their brothers and sisters."

Sidekick Missions will be meeting in early fall to begin reviewing possible locations for 2014 mission trip. The cost of each volunteer to attend this year's trip was \$475. CUMC youth fund-raised with root beer float concessions at 4<sup>th</sup> of July, the Cruise in for Christ Car Show, and with wreath and garland sales before Christmas.

Thank you, Sam, Jordan, Jake and Eugene, for taking this opportunity to serve others in Jesus' name!

### Breastfeeding Minute

### Storing Expressed Breast Milk

Almost every breastfeeding mom will need to store milk for their baby at some time. Once the milk is expressed it needs to be handled with as much care as when it was expressed to insure it will remain safe for baby to consume at a later time. The USDA, pump manufacturers such as Medela and Ameda, your local healthcare provider and local WIC office all have information on how to store milk properly. While there is some debate on how long to store milk, the following information is in line with what the USDA recommends. Breast milk should be stored in clean glass bottles, hard plastic bottles or disposable plastic bags specifically designed for breast milk. Ordinary plastic bags are not considered safe for storage because of the risk or cracking and leaking. Milk should be stored in the amounts it will be used, typically 2 to 4 ounces per bag. If you are freezing milk in bottles remember to leave about 1 inch of space at the top to allow for expansion during freezing. Never add fresh milk to frozen breast milk. Each container that is stored should be labeled with the date and your baby's name. This will make it easier to use the oldest milk first and helps your caregiver if they

are caring for multiple breastfed babies at the same time. Breast milk can be stored in the back of the refrigerator for 2 days and the freezer for 3-6 months.

A chest freezer will keep milk longer due to a more regulated temperature than a freezer attached to the refrigerator. If you are traveling with bottles of expressed breast milk, store them in a cooler with ice or an ice pack.

### Pasty Bakes

Pasty bakes in September will be the 7th and 21st. We will start prep on the Friday before each pasty bake at about 4 p.m. This includes setting up the work area for Saturday, making the crust, weighing the meat, and a few other things to make Saturday go smoother. It takes about 2 hours if we have 6-7 people to help. Then, we will start making the pasty Saturday at 6 a.m. It is best if we have 12 people on Saturday to help.
