We are blessed to see this in action every day at Centenary United Methodist Church. We give of our time and our gifts, and since all we have is a gift from God, it is only right that we give some back.

The finance committee wants to thank everyone who made a contribution of their time, heart and money during this past month. We recently faced some hard truths about our budget and the future of CUMC and people showed how much they care about their church. We had made a conscious choice as a finance committee and a church council to not borrow internally to pay our apportionments, and because of that, our 2014 apportionments were not being paid to the Wisconsin conference. As you can see, we still have a ways to go towards paying our 2014 apportionments, but we have made great progress in a short time.



I would like to thank everyone who has completed their 2015 pledge card. The church office has received 30 pledge cards so far and we are on our way to being able to prepare the 2015 church budget. If you have not yet filled out your 2015 pledge card, please do so ASAP. They can be mailed to the church office or dropped in the offering plate.

We often shy away from talking about money at church. We don't want to be that church that always asks for your money. By not talking about money, giving and stewardship for the past few years, we may have given the wrong impression that the church functions just fine without the support of all its members. The finance committee is making year-round stewardship its focus for 2015.

Our church needs EVERYONE to play their part in supporting OUR church. If you are not currently making a financial contribution to YOUR church, I am asking you to take some time and reflect on your relationship with Centenary United Methodist Church. How important is your relationship I am challenging every member of CUMC to make a contribution to your church before the end of 2014. 
Trustee News

The exterior renovation project has moved along nicely since my last update. The south entrance doors are near completion except for some paint and trim on the inside the woodworking around the windows and soffit has been repainted on the original church, and church edition. They are continuing to work on the north entrance. The two doors were removed and taken back to Renaissance's and shop where they will be repaired, stripped, and repainted to match the original look. Until these doors are back and installed-- the north entrance will be covered to protect it from the elements as they work on it. Geise electric still needs to install the gutters and possibly some small roof sections. Also, a new electrical panel has replaced the old fuse box in the Sunday school storage closet. This new panel will help supply power for lighting the new north entrance when we repair the concrete and retaining wall next spring.

The church also suffered from a lightning strike recently. This damaged much of the equipment in the sanctuary including the projector and mixer board and hearing loop. Rich Brown has spent many hours working with the insurance company to address these issues and as of today the equipment in the sanctuary has been repaired and the church will be compensated from the insurance company. There is still the possibility that some equipment in the basement Sunday school room is damaged and we are looking into this the trustees are going to address a way of installing a prevention system so that we do not have to go through another lightning strike.

Please be careful as we get into the winter months if you notice some ice outside feel free to spread the salt that will be supplied on the inside of the main entrances.


