The goal is:

(Spiritually interacting with someone, praying with them, talking to or counseling them about their spiritual life, inviting them to or back to church, etc...)

At these levels, our church should be operating on a high missional level and, hopefully and prayerfully, it will inspire more people to carve out at least an hour or two each week to help carry out the Mission of Centenary UMC to love God, love others and make disciples of Jesus Christ. If you like to play bingo, then come to the Lafayette Manor in Darlington on November 5 and play Bingo from 2:00 - 3:00 p.m.




