## Trustees News

As of today, November 18th, the restoration work on the church will be done for this year. The church has been tuck pointed, window sills replaced, window sills patched, a new stone slab for the north entrance, and new caulking and backer rod around the wood cornice on top (which should help keep bats out!!) Weather is the only thing stopping us. With the colder temperatures coming up it will be tough to do any painting or concrete work until the start of next year. Renaissance Restoration performed an analysis of the paint used on the exterior of the church. There is a copy of this on the bulletin board by the Serenity room, feel free to take look at it. Using this analysis they have given us the recommended colors to be used on the woodwork of the church to restore it to its original paint scheme. This is something that I will have on display for the church before any work is done.

If you got some free time -- take a couple minutes and just look at the church. Look at the sills, the limestone, and the chimney facing the park. It really is amazing what God has given to us and done through us to help restore the church. This is only the start, so stay tuned for many more things to come!

The Trustees approved a bid from Paul Ranum Construction to replace the smaller deck on the west side of the parsonage. Work should be beginning on that shortly. We have also passed the responsibility of a capital project for the parsonage basement onto the Study Committee to help lay most of the groundwork for this next item ahead.

# CENTENARY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

October 14, 2013

<u>Members present</u>: Becky Upmann, Becky Mootz, Pastor Jeff, Art Finnigan, Lois Finnigan, Tammy White, Lisa Diedrich, Lee Gill, Jeremiah Diedrich, Cherie Uehling, Eugene Uehling, Laura Popp, Joy Redfearn, Dawn Gobrecht and Pam Teasdale.

Pastor Jeff opened with a prayer.

**PASTOR REPORT**- Pastor Jeff stated keeping the meeting to 1 ½ hours. Gave out a paper for Efficient Council Meeting. Everyone agreed that it was a good idea to follow.

**SECRETARY REPORT**- We went through last month's minutes and noted the items that needed to be fixed. They were fixed.

<u>OLD BUSINESS</u>- Retreat- the next retreat will be focusing on Relationships. It is set to take place August 15-17, 2014. Pastor Jeff will be booking this, he is asking trustees to approve this to be taken from the education fund. More information to come as available. Pam Teasdale said to book the date and Jeremiah will take it to trustees to see about taking out of the education fund. Pam read an email from Tricia King about how our church council meetings are ran and her thoughts on that. It was a good report. Everyone gave their opinion on her thoughts.

FINANCE COMMITTEE- Becky M discussed our debt situation. She discussed last month and about not being able to give SPRC an amount for cuts. Tina and Becky are coming up with a profit and loss for the year. Kari Strang is going to help us get back on track. No recommendations have been made due to lack of reports done so far. This needs to wait until the reports from Tina and Kari are done. Hopefully by the November meeting they will know more. No one has been chosen for Finance Chair. They are waiting until the financials are in better order before appointing anyone. Once they are in order a Finance Chair will be chosen. Jeff brought up not doing Pledge cards this year. It wasn't showing a difference in the money given. The committee decided not to do cards this year. They will still be doing the Stewardship program. It is beneficial to have income/expense in the weekly bulletins, newsletters and quarterly reports. It was discussed that we need to be more open on how much money goes out verses coming in, so that everyone is aware. The money situation is stable, but need to keep improving. Paid back 7150 to the education account that was borrowed in the past.

TRUSTEES- Jeremiah stated that they received another \$100,000 donation for the restoration of the church; this is to be used for restoration, tuck pointing, and exterior upkeep of the church. They had a meeting with the donor and Renaissance Restoration out of Galena. They started working on the building. The donors were very specific on what needs to be done and what they money can go towards. Lauren & Rich went to the parsonage to look at the situation. The bathroom is in bad shape and needs to be taken care of as soon as possible. Water collects and goes into the bathroom. Laruen is looking into ways to fix this problem. They are also looking into tiling around the parsonage in the spring to help with this problem. Lease is to be singed for the new building by Jeremiah. The deck on the side of the parsonage is rotting away, looking in to fixing this fall. The down spout needs to be fixed so it doesn't flood the parsonage yard.

<u>MEMORIAL</u>- Joy started out by saying that the memorial committee hasn't met. She gave an update on what has been purchased. A reimbursement has been made to Eugene Uehling for the purchase of the video equipment. Lifeline will be coming to fix the streaming problem. She also stated that there are more items that will be purchased. They will let us know when that happens.

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u>- Michelle Jackson stated that they will be starting the First Program on October 20- November 10<sup>th</sup>. This program is church wide. UNICEF boxes were handed out to the children. The Christmas program was discussed and they will be doing a total of 4 songs, which include 1 with bells, 2 with choir and 1 with the junior high kids using multi tracs. They also discussed finding a place to store the bells.

**ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL**- They will be doing the First Program as well.

#### **NURTURE COMMITTEE- NO REPORT**

**OUTREACH**-Jeff gave a report. Gave us a new paper about how outreach should be done. 1) To touch someone outside the wall, 2) to observe the local events. They are going to start looking for needs of our committees. The committee will be helping Pastor Jeff do this. Outreach people need to get information from different ministries and bring to church council to see if they can help. Help with relationships to reach out and help people. This statement was passed by the church council and will be the new way Outreach will be ran. Outreach committee will recruit people to help with ministries. Church council passed this effective immediately.

YOUTH- Eugene Uehling started off by stating that the Youth Group Meeting time has been changed from Sunday nights to Sunday at 11:45. He said the first one went well. They had 11 youth and 6 adult leaders with the hopes that more come. They changed the time after great consideration; they discussed it with youth, parents and leaders. They took a field trip 2 weeks ago to the Pumpkin Patch and picked pumpkins for cheesefest. They had 23 people go that day. Everyone who went got a pumpkin to take home as well. They did make a scarecrow for cheesefest. They won 2<sup>nd</sup> place and received a \$100 check. They will be starting the First Stewardship program that will run parallel to the one the church is doing. They have started selling Greenery and Wreaths. Kids have the selling sheets. They will be in Saturday November 23 in time for thanksgiving decorating. They are also selling That's My Pan. Kids have order forms for them, as well as samples by the church office for all to see. They will be taking orders for them until December 1st. So that way everyone can get them in time for Christmas. They sold both at the cheesefest booth. They made \$200 at the cheesefest booth. They talked about meeting with the Sidekick people. They discussed the Youth Mission Trip which they are hoping will be a western destination working with the community. Father JoGee Meet with Pastor Jeff about joining activities with our youth group. They will be discussing it with Abby and Tom.

<u>WORSHIP</u>- Lisa Diedrich started out by saying that they had 7 people attend the technical training. They will need help with some services. If you are interested in helping please contact her. She said that the band will be playing October 13 & 27, November 17 & 24 and December 8 & 24. They are ordering an adaptor for the IPAD. She said they had a flag making on the weekend.

<u>SPRC-</u>Tina was not present but other SPRC members were. They said they have a meeting on October 28<sup>th</sup>. No decisions have been made yet. Hopefully at the meeting.

#### **STUDY COMMITTEE**- NO REPORT

OTHER ITEMS DISCUSSED- Church Conference paperwork was handed out to those needing to do these. Please do your papers and get them back to the office as soon as possible. The Annual Church Conference Meeting will be Monday December 9<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. There will be a Pasty Luncheon on November 30<sup>th</sup> from 11-1. They are looking for helpers for the day. It will be \$8 for adult and \$4 for child. The dinner will include pasty, coleslaw, dessert and drink. They need help baking at 7am and 10am for help setting up. Planning on serving about 110 people. If you can help please let Cherie Uehling know. There will be the annual church dinner/auction on November 21<sup>st</sup>. Pam Harker will be putting a food list of items needed together. They need helpers for the night as well. Please donate items for selling.


# Women's Small Group

# Calling all people who want to get healthy once and for all!!!!



Okay, for the first time ever we will have a weight loss competition here at CUMC. Just like popular weight loss TV shows, this is your first challenge. You get to pick when you start the competition. However, here's the catch. Whenever you start determines your weigh-in date at the end of the competition. In essence, it keeps the competition fair for everyone. Also, keep in mind that we will be going by weight loss percentage and not total pounds lost to determine the winner, which means we all have a fair chance of winning the contest. Here's how it's going to work. First, there is a \$20 entry fee per person to enter the contest. A 10% tithing fee will be taken off the total and go directly to the church. Of the remaining total, 70% will go to the winner and 30% to the runner up. Maybe you just want to join to help the cause or be a supporter for others to have a shoulder to lean on.
