At the time I am writing this the Sanctuary update is not yet complete. However, I just had to write this month about a couple inspiring experiences that have happened during the updates.

The first was seeing the tile floor under the red carpet. This was the original floor that members and visitors of our church walked on a long time ago...seeing it and walking on it I felt closer to the church, more connected to all of you because I saw and learned more about your history here at Centenary.

Second, with the new neutral paint colors, I could not help but notice how brilliant the colors of the stained glass windows now look as the light of the sun penetrates and cascades into the sanctuary. Those stained glass windows shined down on our past; on that original tile church floor and then the red shag carpet we had for years. Now, that same light shines on our present with the new carpet, paint and pew upholstery... and it will shine on our future as a church. Those stained glass windows have now become almost a metaphor for God's grace in that the beautiful colors and light that shines through is actually a connection to our past, an anchor to our present and a conduit to our future.

This is exactly why we get together every weekend to worship God. This is exactly why we have Sunday School, Food Pantry, Pasty Bakes and Youth Group and all the other ministries, events and projects here at Centenary UMC. So that all of humanity can learn the historical story of our relationship with

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God, connect with that story through the Christian community offered to us now in Christ, and become part of that story by becoming part of the future God promises us as beloved children of God in the Kingdom of God now and forever.

I pray when we have our first service in the new sanctuary that those stained glass windows inspire all of you like they did me. Furthermore, I pray the grace of God, like the light shining on all of us through those windows, permeates every part of us as Christians and as a church, as a Christian community... and inspires us to love God, love others and make disciples of Jesus Christ by sharing that story and inviting others to become a part of it, too.

Ash Wednesday Services

The beginning of the holy time of self-reflection on our relationship with Jesus Christ as Christians and as a Church (commonly known as Lent) begins Wednesday, February 13 on "Ash Wednesday." Ash Wednesday is a Christian tradition where God's children may be anointed with the ash of palm branches (from the previous years' Palm Sunday) to remind them of their mortality and the importance of and the hope found in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Centenary UMC will have two Ash Wednesday Services this year in order to accommodate as many people receiving the ash as possible. The first service will be at noon and the second will be at 6:00 p.m. If the sanctuary is ready both services will be held there, otherwise both services will be held in the Fellowship Hall in the basement.

Please pass this information on to as many folks as possible, and feel free to contact the church with any questions. Hope to see many of you on this Holy Day as we begin this wonderful and dramatic season known as Lent in the Christian Tradition.

Passover Banquet

It is with great joy and excitement that Centenary UMC announces that Ryan Karp, a Messianic Jew (A Jewish Christian who believes Jesus Christ is the Messiah) from Chosen People Ministries in New York, NY will be coming here to Centenary UMC to host a Messiah in the Passover Banquet on Wednesday, March 13 @ 6:00 p.m. (This will be the Confirmation students class that night so they and their families are strongly encouraged to attend).

Youth Group News



Breastfeeding Minute

Pumping Breastmilk

Breastmilk is the best milk for your baby even when you are not able to nurse. If you must be separated, pumping breastmilk is a great solution to what your baby will eat while you are away. Many moms find pumping takes a little practice but once they get a good routine it goes very smoothly. First, mom needs to decide which pump she is going to use, whether it is a manual pump or an electric pump. Read the instruction manual when available or get current information about the brand and type of pump you have. Each is a little different. Next choose a quiet, comfortable place without too many distractions for you to pump. Third wash your hands with warm soapy water. Remember you are collecting your baby's food; you want things as clean and sanitary as possible. Fourth, relax and think about your baby. Looking at a picture of your baby, listening to relaxing music or smelling a piece of your baby's clothes may help you relax and focus on pumping for your baby. It may take a few minutes for the

milk to start flowing, but be patient. Once the milk has slowed to only a drip or stopped your pumping session is done. It may take several practice sessions to get a good flow of milk with the pump. Remember pumping should be comfortable if it hurts adjust your settings for maximum comfort or ask for help from a nurse or lactation consultant.

Growing in Generosity - The "Extra" Chair

As they prepared for their annual Valentine's Day dinner and dance outing last year, three couples who meet monthly to socialize realized how much food their local food pantry could buy for the cost of one of their tickets for the night. As they met to finalize the details, one of the men suggested they try something new. He asked each couple to set aside an amount for a "Third Ticket" or an "Extra Chair" and to save that money to give to charity at the end of the year, instead of buying each other Christmas gifts.

Through their "Third Ticket" or "Extra Chair" plan, each couple placed the cost of an extra ticket to the show or play or the cost of an extra dinner in a jar they kept at home. If they went out to dinner and the cost was \$20 apiece, each couple put another \$20 bill in the jar. If they went out to a play and tickets cost \$30 to \$40, each couple put that amount in the jar. Even if they just met on the spur of the moment for a quick lunch at \$5 apiece, they went home and put an extra \$5 in the jar.

Their motive was to save regularly in order to make a substantial charitable gift at the end of the year. They found it also reminded them to pray more regularly for persons in need.

At the end of the first year, their "Extra Chair" savings totaled just over \$3,000. On the night they gathered to share their savings and determine which charities to support, they started with a pot luck instead of going out to dinner. Then they divided their gifts between their church's shared connectional giving (apportionments) and three extra mission funds: their local food pantry, a mission outreach to children in a nearby state and a world hunger organization. They reported, "It was the best Christmas gathering the six of us have ever had!"

Perhaps we can use their idea to start saving for our own Christmas miracles this year!


