

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

How do you properly thank someone? Some might say you send a private thank you card, some might publically acknowledge and thank someone for something they did at a gathering of some kind. How do we thank God? The answer if all of the above.

When we reach a point of maturity in our faith that we realize it is God that has given us this life and everything in it; that we owe and completely depend on Him and who He is in every aspect of our life and every breath we breathe, that is when we can follow Paul's advice in 1 Thessalonians. In what ways are we as individuals and as a church thanking Him for all He has done for us through His Son Jesus Christ and the power of His Holy Spirit...and maybe how we could, perhaps, work on thanking him continually a little more often?

The people you love need the transforming grace that only Jesus Christ can bring. Invite the people you love to Jesus!


Finance News

Why are pledge cards important? What does the church need to know NOW what I plan to give in 2016?


Trust me when I say we don't ask people to fill out 2016 pledge cards without really needing the information. Pledge cards give the finance committee information needed to prepare the 2016 annual budget requested by the conference. We need an idea of how much money we will have to work with in 2016. The church's monthly "income" is not regular, predictable or sometimes dependable. My long-time involvement in church finance has truly taught me the power of both prayer and faith, and I am asking you to pray about your giving in 2016.

Pledge cards are not binding promises – if you pledge to give \$100 a month to the church and at the end of 2016 you have given less than your pledge, we will not send you a bill. Your pledge gives the finance committee an idea of what you expect to be able to give in the next year. It also makes you think about how important your church is to you and where it sits in relation to your other financial commitments. No dollar amount is too small to be a pledge for 2016. God knows what you can afford and all gifts are gratefully received. The finance committee only receives information about the dollar amount of the pledges; we never know the names of who has turned in a pledge card.

If you are interested in how money is spent at CUMC, you may obtain a copy of the monthly church finance paperwork at any finance committee meeting held the second Monday of each month at 6 p.m. prior to the monthly church council meeting. You may also request a copy from the church office, or you can contact me with any questions. Thank you for your support and interest in the financial future of CUMC.

Advent by Candlelight



the SPRC.....

Per the Book of Discipline, the SPRC is the administrative unit in the local church where staff and congregational interests are integrated to focus on the mission of the church. People serving on the SPRC committee must be engaged in and attentive to their Christian spiritual development so as to give proper leadership in the responsibilities with which the committee is entrusted. Special tasks for the SPRC include the following, educating and reminding both staff and the congregation to focus on working together toward the mission of the church by promoting unity and encouraging, strength-

ening, nurturing, supporting and respecting the pastor, staff and their families. It includes supporting lifelong learning and spiritual renewal for all staff. The committee shall reflect biblically and theologically on the role and work of the pastor and staff as they carry out their leadership responsibilities. The committee shall assist the pastor and staff in assessing their gifts, maintaining health holistically and work-life balance, and setting priorities for leadership and service. It is the responsibility of the committee to communicate with the committee on nominations and leadership development and/or the church council when there is a need for other leaders or for employed staff to perform in areas where utilization of the gifts of the pastor and staff proves an inappropriate stewardship of time.

Wednesday Night Ministry: It Keeps Growing!

Our Wednesday Night Dinner and Worship is off to an amazing start! There has been an average of 48 people for dinner and 50+ for worship each week. If you haven't had the opportunity to experience it, here is a little snippet of what Wednesday evenings look like.

 Beginning at 4:30 you would find final prep work for dinner while kids work complete their homework in the

fellowship hall. When their homework is complete, the kids can play board games or color at activity tables set up for them.

- At 5:30 dinner is served, and everyone enjoys the blessing of food and time spent in fellowship with church family.
- At 6:30 everyone heads up to worship, which always begins with several inspired songs led by Ed Santiago, often assisted by the talents of Ian Schwartz and Danelle Schmid. After the music, the adults greet each other, and the 4k-4th Grade children head down to children's church which is held in the fellowship hall downstairs.

From the very first night, it became apparent that more helpers were needed; the average number of children at the children's church program each week has been about 25+. Jacklyn Wood was an answer to prayer as she stepped forward to lead our 3rd and 4th graders. There is still a blessed opportunity for someone to lead the younger students (preschool to grade 2). If you have a heart for children and would like to help out with this ministry, it would be greatly appreciated. If you have the gift of cooking and cleaning there are also opportunities for a rotation of kitchen helpers to help prepare and clean up the Wednesday night meal .
