




I have been there, you know. Back when I wasn't a Pastor and was a lay member of my church with a job and a family just like you.

When trials came, when demands on my time intensified, when things felt like they were out of control, we would do what I called, "circle the wagons". We would stay home and take the time we would normally spend in

our Christian community and with our church family to just "take a break" or find a day when "nothing was going on."

However, what we eventually found was that taking time away from our Christian community and church family DID NOT help at all. At the end of the day, our priorities were still our priorities, and we had simply stolen time from the place and the people that would remind us what our priorities should be and sacrificed that in order to keep our priorities on the things of this world.

We also found that once we stopped going and being part of the church for a few weeks that it was much harder to go back to church and to keep God in our lives. New routines and a different rhythm established in our life became huge obstacles to practicing our faith and a new pattern of distraction kept us from participation in our Christian community.

Later on, we realized that when things became hectic, it was much more beneficial to fight for our time **with** our Christian community and church family. When we did, we were not only reminded but inspired to focus on our relationship with God, our callings as Christians and as a church, and you know what else? Things became clearer, issues and trials were dealt with quicker and with more ease, and our schedules became simpler as we focused on souls and the eternal rather than the mortal and finite resources of time and money.

I invite you to do the same. This is the time of the year where the world makes serious demands on our time and our families. Don't sacrifice your Christian community and your church. Do not allow the world to take your focus off of God and your relationship with Him and your calling in this life....keep coming to church, keep participating in ministry, keep praying, keep reading the Bible and watch how God through His grace and His church leads you through and carries you over the stress, pressure and complicated times of your life.

Finance News

Why are pledge cards important? What does the church need to know NOW what I plan to give in 2017?

Trust me when I say we don't ask people to fill out 2017 pledge cards without really needing the information. Pledge cards give the finance committee information needed to prepare the 2017 annual budget requested by the conference. We need an idea of how much money we will have to work with in 2017. The church's monthly "income" is not regular, predictable or sometimes dependable. My long-time involvement in church finance has truly taught me the power of both prayer and faith, and I am asking you to pray about your giving in 2017. **Please return you Pledge Card by November 16th.**

Pledge cards are not binding promises – if you pledge to give \$100 a month to the church and at the end of 2017 you have given less than your pledge, we will not send you a bill. Your pledge gives the finance committee an idea of what you expect to be able to give in the next year. It also makes you think about how important your church is to you and where it sits in relation to your other financial commitments. No dollar amount is too small or to big to be a pledge for 2017. God knows what you can afford and all gifts are gratefully received. The finance committee only receives information about the dollar amount of the pledges; we never know the names of who has turned in a pledge card.

If you are interested in how money is spent at CUMC, you may obtain a copy of the monthly church finance paperwork at any Finance Committee meeting held the second Monday of each month at 6 p.m. prior to the monthly Church Council meeting. You may also request a copy from the church office, or you can contact me with any questions. Thank you for your support and interest in the financial future of CUMC.

At the end of the evening, we will be giving away the copy of the movie that we watched to one lucky attendee! Hope to see you there!


There is no charge to attend, but children under 6th grade must be accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult; after all, we want this to be a special time for families!


RAISING MONEY TO BUY A

THE STORY OF G: In August 2003, when he was only two years old, "G" was diagnosed with a malignant brain tumor called medulloblastoma along with malignant tumors in his spine. After an 18 hour brain surgery, 99% of the tumor was removed, but he was given only a 10% chance of survival. Yet G has persisted through procedures, chemotherapy, and learning to walk three times to be cancer free now for 14 years. In July 2005 G woke up and could not walk. A MRI revealed he had developed lesions on his brain. The way you see G today is because of the lesions. G's mom Melissa has set out on a quest to give her son the best possible life. 



From Our Parish Nurse.....

NOVEMBER IS NATIONAL DIABETES MONTH

More than 29 million Americans fight diabetes every day, often unnoticed. This is why for American Diabetes Month[®] — sponsored by Colgate Total[®] and Medtronic Diabetes[®] — the American Diabetes Association[®] is calling on individuals to declare "This Is Diabetes." Share your stories and snapshots on social media this November using **#ThisIsDiabetes**. For more information, visit diabetes.org/adm.

Diabetes Symptoms

The following symptoms of diabetes are typical. However, some people with type 2 diabetes have symptoms so mild that they go unnoticed.

Common symptoms of diabetes:

- Urinating often
- Feeling very thirsty
- Feeling very hungry even though you are eating
- Extreme fatigue
- Blurry vision
- Cuts/bruises that are slow to heal
- Weight loss even though you are eating more (type 1)
- Tingling, pain, or numbness in the hands/feet (type 2)

Early detection and treatment of diabetes can decrease the risk of developing the **complications of diabetes**.

Diagnosing Diabetes and Learning About Prediabetes

There are several ways to diagnose diabetes. Each way usually needs to be repeated on a second day to diagnose diabetes.

Testing should be carried out in a health care setting (such as your doctor's office or a lab). If your doctor determines that your blood glucose level is very high, or if you have classic symptoms of high blood glucose in addition to one positive test, your doctor may not require a second test to diagnose diabetes.

A1C- The A1C test measures your average blood glucose for the past 2 to 3 months. The advantages of being diagnosed this way are that you don't have to fast or drink anything. Diabetes is diagnosed at an A1C of greater than or equal to 6.5%

Fasting Plasma Glucose (FPG)- This test checks your fasting blood glucose levels. Fasting means after not having anything to eat or drink (except water) for at least 8 hours before the test. This test is usually done first thing in the morning, before breakfast. Diabetes is diagnosed at fasting blood glucose of greater than or equal to 126 mg/dl.



Oral Glucose Tolerance Test (also called the OGTT)-The OGTT is a two-hour test that checks your blood glucose levels before and 2 hours after you drink a special sweet drink. It tells the doctor how your body processes glucose. Diabetes is diagnosed at 2 hour blood glucose of greater than or equal to 200 mg/dl



Random (also called Casual) Plasma Glucose Test

This test is a blood check at any time of the day when you have severe diabetes symptoms. Diabetes is diagnosed at blood glucose of greater than or equal to 200 mg/dl

What is Prediabetes?

Before people develop type 2 diabetes, they almost always have "prediabetes" — blood glucose levels that are higher than normal but not yet high enough to be diagnosed as diabetes. Doctors sometimes refer to prediabetes as impaired glucose tolerance (IGT) or impaired fasting glucose (IFG), depending on what test was used when it was detected. This condition puts you at a higher risk for developing type 2 diabetes and cardiovascular disease.

No Clear Symptoms

There are no clear symptoms of prediabetes, so, you may have it and not know it. Some people with prediabetes may have some of the <u>symptoms of diabetes</u> or even <u>problems from diabetes</u> already. You usually find out that you have prediabetes when being tested for diabetes. If you have prediabetes, you should be checked for type 2 diabetes every one to two years.

Results indicating prediabetes are:

- An A1C of 5.7% 6.4%
- Fasting blood glucose of 100 125 mg/dl
- An OGTT 2 hour blood glucose of 140 mg/dl 199 mg/dl

Preventing Type 2 Diabetes

You will not develop type 2 diabetes automatically if you have prediabetes. For some people with prediabetes, early treatment can actually return blood glucose levels to the normal range.

Research shows that you can lower your risk for type 2 diabetes by 58% by: Losing 7% of your body weight (or 15 pounds if you weigh 200 pounds) Exercising moderately (such as brisk walking) 30 minutes a day, five days a week

Don't worry if you can't get to your <u>ideal body</u> weight. Losing even 10 to 15 pounds can make a huge difference.
