

### New Wednesday Programming



Whether you work or are out of town on weekends, your family's schedule makes it hard to make it to worship on the weekends, or something came up and you missed your regular weekend worship service, we invite and encourage you to attend the Wednesday Night Praise Service at 6:30 p.m.

The Wednesday Night Praise Service will be similar to the 10:30 a.m. Praise Worship services on Sunday with

Ed Santiago leading the praise music and Pastor Jeff giving the same message from the previous weekend. There will also be the Sacrament of Holy Communion on the Wednesday following Holy Communion Weekend.

### Before Wednesday Night Praise Service

Beginning Wednesday, September 16 there will be a meal and fellowship every Wednesday Night at 5:30 pm. (an hour before the new Wednesday Night Praise Service) in the downstairs Fellowship Hall. This means that you don't have to make dinner before you come to church on Wednesday night!

Suggested donation is \$1.50/person or \$5.00/family (up to 7 people).



### During Wednesday Night Praise Service



Children's Church is a special time of worship designed to engage children during the Wednesday night service. Children's Church features music, scripture lessons, and prayers that are easily accessible and relevant to children. It also provides the opportunity for parents to focus on their time of worship while their children have a separate worship experience designed just for them.

After the meal and fellowship, everyone will go to the sanctuary to sing praise songs at the beginning of the new 6:30 p.m. Wednesday Night Praise Worship service. After the opening songs, children K-4<sup>th</sup> Grade will be invited to return to the Fellowship Hall downstairs for Children's Church.

Motions made and approved:

Art Finnigan as Church Council Chair (3 yr. term). Nomination was due to Pam Teasdale's resignation as Chair in e-mail dated 6/9/15.

Brad Mootz as Lay Leader (3 yr. term)

Tina Cruse as Church Council Vice Chair

Sarah Santiago as Christian Education Coordinator (updated term for Sunday School Coordinator)

Becky Mootz as Interim Secretary while Becky Upmann is unable to write them. Pastor Jeff asked for permission to bypass LLC and recruit a new Secretary (will have voice and vote and will take notes)-approved.

Pastor's Report: To streamline 10:30 worship, beginning July 19, prayer concerns during 10:30 service will change to: 1-write concerns on cards, 2-silent prayer time, 3-pray with prayer team member at front of church after service. Pastor Jeff would like feedback on that once it starts.

After learning that there was some confusion as to how prayer concerns are handled, Council suggested putting an article in the newsletter explaining that all prayer concerns are given to give to pray over, but not all of them go on the e-mail that goes out weekly. Pastor Jeff will write the article.

Secretaries Report: Gingerbread is possibly moving from Masons building, which will affect Food Pantry. Pastor Jeff recommended that Trustees meet with Gingerbread, Food Pantry, and Masons to officially discuss the plans for building rental, Food Pantry location if no longer in Mason building, etc.

Eugene Uehling arrived.

Cherie Uehling arrived.

Finance Report: Tina reported that all bills were paid, but still behind in apportionments. Once June's additional \$500 is paid, we will be at 34% of apportionments for the year paid. We will continue paying \$500/mo. over designated toward apportionments, and we will try to start paying \$200/mo. for the remainder of the year to replenish the Insurance Deductible.

We are doing better financially this summer than we were last summer.

### Old Business:

SPRC made the following motion: "Give Ed a raise to \$150/week with no incentives, with a review in 6 months. Ed will work with Pastor Jeff on programming to start Wednesday, September 16 at 6:30. Criteria for continuing Wednesday service will be discussed at next SPRC meeting on August 23.

Pastor Jeff has agreed to continue Saturday services until September 12, at which time it would be taken over by lay speakers and the name changed to Lay Led Casual Service. SPRC is willing to work with the Saturday attendees on contacting lay speakers based on a list given by the church office, and asks that those attendees help out with that.

Betty Gleason has agreed to book speakers for the first 4-6 weeks as well as contact those attendees to have them help book speakers. SPRC will make every effort to secure a volunteer coordinator to continue after Betty. They have agreed to pay up to \$50 per service for a speaker, but would like to use volunteers first if possible. They also recommend that the same lay speaker not do consecutive weeks." {In a nutshell: PJ doing Saturday service til 9/12. Lay leaders doing Saturday service starting 9/19. PJ starting Wednesday service 9/16.} Motion passed.

As a result of the motion passing, JoAnn Meyer will be providing dinner and children's church during the Wednesday service in order to make it an adult service, not another 10:30. Suggested donation will be \$1.50/person with a maximum of \$5/family. This will also begin September 16.

### Committee Reports

Trustees: Mason building lease goes through either 9/26/15 or 10/1/15. The new glass doors are having opening problems...Eugene is contacting Dubuque Window & Door. The ladies' room window glass is broken...we will likely need to replace it ourselves. Renaissance still has some weather stripping to do around restored front doors. Trustees is deciding on concrete contractors for the work needed in front of the church.

SPRC: They will have a listening session July 23 from 6:30-8:30 for anyone who has any comments or concerns about paid staff members and the procedure for reporting such... session will have 2 SPRC members and Pastor Jeff on hand. Ed has been hired to be substitute pastor while Jeff is gone on vacation August 15 & 16.

Memorials: no report

Nurture & Care: They will be bringing a presentation to Church Council next month.

Fellowship Group: Held a funeral lunch.

Outreach: Met with Brad Mootz about the 4-7 year plan. TLC made a suggestion to Outreach to come up with a ladder for a ministry to keep connected with college students.

Youth: They just returned from a mission trip to Colorado...made a presentation during church July 12.

Sunday School: This area will now be known as Christian Education, since it is more than just Sunday School. Sarah Santiago is the new coordinator. There will be a volunteer meeting in August. There will be a Vacation Bible School helper meeting July 28 at 6:00...they are still looking for volunteers. The Shullsburg Fund gave a \$1500 for VBS.

### Additional Committees:

TLC: They asked for permission to define "active" and "inactive" members (definition would include attendance, volunteering, and giving)...approved. They are also working on a mailing to people who have been inactive in the last year.

He remains the school's all-time scoring, assists, and steals leader. Later he joined the Harlem Globetrotters and was named Mr. Globetrotter many times. He retired in March 2000 and has been a motivational speaker since.
