


Upcoming Sermon Series




Adult Sunday School

We are going to start this year by looking at "Mere Christianity" by C.S. Lewis, a book that came about as a result of a number of radio broadcasts produced during World War II. It brings together what he saw as the fundamental truths of the religion. Rejecting the boundaries that divide Christianity's many denominations,

C.S. Lewis finds a common ground on which all those who have Christian faith can stand together, proving that "at the center of each there is something, or a Someone, who against all divergences of belief, all differences of temperament, all memories of mutual persecution, speaks the same voice." This message continues to be relevant to us in the 21st Century.

Arguably one of the most influential Christian writers of the 20th Century C.S. Lewis had some important things to say about our faith and the way that we understand the teachings of Jesus. He wrote more than thirty books, allowing him to reach a vast audience, and his works continue to



attract thousands of new readers every year. C. S. Lewis's most distinguished and popular accomplishments include *Mere Christianity*, Out of the *Silent Planet*, *The Great Divorce*, *The Screwtape Letters*, and the universally acknowledged classics in *The Chronicles of Narnia*. To date, the Narnia books have sold over 100 million copies and been transformed into three major motion pictures.

We meet in the Serenity Room at 9:15. We'll have coffee and tea available and as always, we'll have some good conversation about the relevance of what we learn to our own lives. This year we plan to welcome High School students who may like to join in our discussion.

Wednesday Nights Ministry Dinner & Worship

I always get a little sad when summer ends. But I also get excited at the joy that a new program year at church brings. As we fall into the routines of back to work and back to school, we also have new opportunities at CUMC to worship, serve and grow! If you cannot be in church on Sundays, Wednesday evenings provide a great alternative. The best part is that you don't have to mess up your kitchen. Let us do the work! All you have to do is join us at 5:30 for dinner. There is a suggested dona-

tion of \$1.50 per person or just \$5.00 per family, but no one is ever turned away who cannot afford a do-

We have games and activities out for the kids while the adults chat. We eat at 5:30 and then clean up as a group afterward. Worship begins at 6:30 with announcements and music; the kids are then released to children's church where they are split up into two different age groups where they do activities and learn about God and His great love for us. After worship service, parents pick up the students downstairs in the fellowship hall. Our time together usually concludes around 7:15-7:30.

As you are looking to set your fall schedule, please consider giving Wednesday's at CUMC a try, especially if fall sports or weekend trips make Sunday Service difficult. I know that you will love the dinners, the fellowship, and the worship.



The Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation exists to help United Methodist churches, ministries, boards, and agencies with all things financial regarding their minis-

tries. They hope to support churches and groups in expanding their ministry through projects and creative ministries. If you have a new ministry idea or event that you would like help funding, consider applying for a grant. (These grants are to be considered seed money rather than continuing support, and the typically phase out after three years.) There is a round of grants offered in the Fall and sometimes again in the Spring. The fall round deadline is November 1, and the spring round deadline is March 1.
